














Wider strategies for current academic year

- Continue to fund free places for disadvantaged pupils to our after-school club, to ensure that pupils get a cooked meal, are heard to read and get their homework completed regularly.
- Continue to support disadvantaged pupils with behavioural support at break and lunchtimes.
- Continue to support disadvantaged pupils with the additional costs associated with their education.

Projected spending: £24,000

Review: last year's aims and outcomes

Aim	Outcome
Progress in reading, writing and maths	Steady improvement in disadvantaged pupil progress from 2018 to 2019. On track towards aim.
Homework Support	The vast majority of our disadvantaged pupils now make use of this offer. Analysis shows that the additional support is increasing reading outcomes.
Behavioural issues at break times	Very few issues regarding behaviour are now created at breaktimes and lunchtimes due to the high levels of engagement and activity away from lesson times.
Financial support for additional educational experiences	All disadvantaged pupils accessed our residential visit offers last academic year.
